PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT COURSEWORK

May be taken before KIN 628, but may not be taken after or concurrently with KIN 628

GROUP 1 - 3 to 9 hours from Kinesiology (KIN) or Health Education (HED) coursework

An Advisor must approve courses selected. No more than 3 semester hours of KIN 119 may be counted. No more than 3 semester hours of KIN 127L, 227L, and 327L may be counted. KIN 311K – Sport Psychology or KIN 325K – Integrated Communication for Sports recommended.

GROUP 2 - 3 to 6 hours of diversity coursework chosen from the following:

ALD 322 — Individual Differences, ALD 327 — Sociocultural Influences on Learning, SOC 333K — Sociology of Gender, SOC 321K — Race, Sport and Identity, ANT 324L — Race and Sport in African-American Life, *or* CMS 355K — Intercultural Communication.

APPLYING FOR ADMISSION TO THE SPORT MANAGEMENT MAJOR

The Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology degree, with a major in Sport Management, is a restricted program. Students interested in the program must complete required prerequisite courses and apply to the program by the deadline: **May 1 for Fall entry, or December 1 for Spring entry**. Applications may be picked up in Belmont Hall (BEL) Room 1005. Any questions regarding deadlines, applications, or prerequisite courses should be directed to the advisors in BEL 1005.

The following criteria are the *minimum requirements* for consideration for admission into the program and do not guarantee admission:

1. Overall **UT grade point average** of a **minimum 2.5**. The actual cutoff might be considerably higher, depending upon the applicant pool. Only courses taken at UT Austin will be utilized in calculating this grade point average.
2. **Completion of all prerequisite courses**. Note: The grade point average for the prerequisite courses will be calculated and the students will be rank-ordered on the basis of the prerequisite coursework GPA. Only organized courses taken at UT Austin will be utilized in calculating the GPA, i.e., no CLEP, transfer, or correspondence credits.

Prerequisite courses:

- ___ **KIN 316** — Structure & Organization of Sport (grade of “B” or better required)
- ___ **A UT Austin writing component**, or RHE 306 if taken at UT Austin
- ___ **Foreign Language 506/508K**, or six hours of foreign language substitution classes
- ___ **PSY 301** — Introduction to Psychology **or** **SOC 302** — Introduction to the Study of Society
- ___ Three semester hours of **Economics** — ECO 304K or 304L recommended
- ___ Three semester hours of **computer applications**. MIS 302F or INF 312 recommended
- ___ **CMS 306M** — Professional Communication Skills
- ___ A minimum of **nine semester hours in a chosen minor**. All hours completed at UT Austin towards the minor will be used to calculate the prerequisite coursework GPA. **Three hours of the minor must be taken at UT Austin.**

3. **A personal resume**. Due to the professional development focus of our program, students must submit a completed resume as part of their application. Pre-Sport Management majors can see the Career Services representative in BEL 1005 for resume assistance.

Graduation and Residency Requirements

To receive a degree from the College of Education, a student must have been registered in the college for at least two long-session semesters or the equivalent. A candidate for a degree must be registered in the college either in residence or in absentia the semester or summer session the degree is to be awarded, and must apply for the degree no later than the specified deadline. The student must have an official degree audit on file prior to applying for the degree (upon completing fifty semester hours of coursework). Sixty hours counted toward the degree must be completed in residence, as well as twenty-four of the last thirty hours counted toward the degree. Coursework taken out-of-residence, including coursework through continuing and distance education or from another institution, will not be allowed in a student's final semester at The University. Students who are graduating in the summer may appeal to take courses at another institution in the first summer term only.
