ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ABOUT POST-BACCALAUREATE EC-12 CERTIFICATION IN ART, MUSIC, OR THEATRE ARTS

1. **Applying to The University of Texas at Austin** — *Application for admission to The University of Texas at Austin is separate from application to enter the Professional Development Sequence.* You must be admitted to UT Austin before you can pursue this program. Contact the Office of Admissions for application to UT Austin, or visit <http://www.utexas.edu/student/admissions>. UT admission deadlines are March 1 for summer or fall, and October 1 for spring.
2. **Applying for the Professional Development Sequence (PDS)** — Students must apply for admission to the Professional Development Sequence by March 1 to enter in the fall semester. The application for the Professional Development Sequence is available only online. Contact the College of Education Student Division (SZB 216) at (512) 471-1308 for information, or visit <http://www.edb.utexas.edu/education/edServices/fieldexp/>.
3. **Residence Rules for Student Teaching and Certification** — All candidates must do their student teaching in residence at UT Austin. Student teaching must be completed no more than 3 years prior to being recommended to the State for certification, otherwise, additional experience or coursework may be necessary.
4. **Oral and Written Communication Proficiency** — Oral and written communication proficiency will be reviewed during the first semester of the Professional Development Sequence. Successful completion of an Individualized Performance Plan (IPP), which outlines steps for addressing your difficulties, will be required if necessary.
5. **GPA Requirements** — Early Childhood to Twelfth Grade certification seekers in Art, Music, or Theatre must have a minimum 3.0 UT Austin grade point average for admission to the Professional Development Sequence (PDS), as well as a minimum 3.0 g.p.a. for their respective curricular area (see front). In addition, these minimum UT Austin g.p.a.'s must be maintained throughout the sequence, and are required for completion and subsequent recommendation for certification. Applicants who select EC-12 Music as their teaching field must be in good standing in upper-division music studies course work and must present a 3.0 average g.p.a. on all UT coursework plus (1) a 3.0 g.p.a. in applied music on the principal instrument, (2) a 3.0 g.p.a. in ensemble, (3) a 3.0 g.p.a. in required academic music courses (courses with a MUS prefix), and (4) a 3.0 g.p.a. in all upper-division music studies coursework, with no grade lower than B in an upper-division music studies class. Applicants who select EC-12 Art must have a 3.0 g.p.a. in completed VAS, ART, and ARH courses. Applicants who select EC-12 Theatre must have a 3.0 g.p.a. in completed T D courses.
6. **Laptop Initiative** — All UT Austin students engaged in teacher preparation professional certification programs are required to have a laptop computer conforming to prescribed hardware and software specifications. These computers will be required for use in most professional development courses and field experiences, will facilitate innovative instructional technology integration in public school teaching, and will equip our graduates for teaching in Texas classrooms of the future. Under this plan, each specific program defines the semester or course when this requirement will affect its students. In most cases this will occur when a student enters the officially designated "Professional Development Sequence" and so has two to four semesters remaining to complete all certification requirements. In order to provide the best possible support for students and faculty in this innovative project, only one operating system will be supported. 7. **Education Career Services Office** — The College of Education Career Services Office can assist you in making informed career choices. This office schedules a variety of activities, as well as offers extensive resources and support related to employment. Call (512) 471-1511 for more information.
8. **Testing – State Certification Examinations** — Students are strongly encouraged to take their state certification examinations as soon as possible. Certification candidates will take TExES (Texas Examinations of Educator Standards) in the last semester of their coursework or after all certification courses are completed. Early Childhood to Twelfth Grade (EC-12) certification seekers in the fine arts should take the TExES Test 160 Pedagogy and Professional Responsibilities EC-12, as well as the TExES EC-12 in their teaching field: 177 Music EC-12, or 178 Art EC-12, or 180 Theatre EC-12. Currently, the cost of each test is \$120 (subject to change). Study guides are available at <http://texas.ets.org/> under "Preparation Materials".
9. **Application for Certification** — Information about the application procedure should be picked up in SZB 216 after *all* requirements, including completion of a bachelor's degree and required certification tests, are completed. For us to process your recommendation, you must have completed the post-baccalaureate program, have a minimum 3.0 UT Austin g.p.a., and your application and fees must have been submitted to the **State Board for Educator Certification**.
